

Egg Baskets ++++++++ Temecula Quilt Co

Fabric Requirements

12 Delightful Dozen scraps

1/3 yard natural linen

1/8 yard light stripe

Cutting

From each light print, cut:

A-1 square, $3^{7/8}$ " x $3^{7/8}$ " cut once diagonally

B - 1 square, $1^{7/8}$ " x $1^{7/8}$ "

From natural linen, cut:

C-1 strip, $2^{1/2}$ " x 42" | subcut, 24 rectangles $1^{1/2}$ " x $2^{1/2}$ "

 $D \sim 6 \, \text{squares}, 3^{\, 7/8} \, \text{''} \times 3^{\, 7/8} \, \text{''}$ cut once diagonally

 $E \sim 6\,\mathrm{squares}, 2^{7/8}\ \mathrm{x}\,2^{7/8}\ \mathrm{cut}$ once diagonally

From Light Stripe, cut:

 $2 \text{ strips}, 1^{1/2}$ " x 42" - binding

Making the Blocks


1. Using your favorite technique, appliqué twelve basket handles to large linen triangle. [D]


Tip: Use extra light print triangle [A] for handle fabric.

 $2. Sew\ triangle\ [B]\ to\ rectangle\ [C]\ to\ make\ basket\ feet.$

3. Layout and piece block using diagram. Repeat to make

 $12\,\mathrm{blocks}$ that measure $4^{\,1/2}$ " square including seam allowances





- 4. Using guilt diagram layout guilt top in four rows of three blocks. Sew the blocks in each row together. Join the rows alternating seams at intersections.
- 5. Quilt as desired, I hand quilting mine in a diagonal pattern. Bind using single thickness binding. Enjoy!

Make your own set of Delightful eggs



Fabric Requirements and supplies;

12 Delightful Dozen scraps
12 paper mâché eggs, length 2 ^{1/2}" x diameter 1 ^{1/2}"
[I got mine at Hobby Lobby]
White acrylic paint and brush

Cutting for one egg

From one light print cut 4 pieces using egg template

Making the Egg

- 1. Using white paint and foam brush paint eggs white.
- 2. Sew two pairs of sections together along curved side using 1/4" seam allowance.
- 3. Trim seam allowance to 1/8"
- 4. Finger press or use a small iron to press seam allowances flat and in opposite directions.
- 5. With wrong sides together, sew two sections together nesting seam allowances at top of egg in opposite directions. Trim seam allowance to 1/8" and press seam flat.
- 6. Slip paper mâché egg into egg slipcover. Turn bottom edge under about 1/4". Using needle and thread run a basting stitch at bottom edge. Pull up and tie off. **Enjoy!**



Cut 4 pieces for one egg

Seam allowance is included in template
