



Fabric Requirements

1/2 yard light (dark) print | background

1/8 yard bundle Opposite Options

1/4 yard black (cream) stripe

Cutting

From cream print, cut: 3 strips, $2^{3/4}$ " x 42"

 $5\,\mathrm{strips}, 1^{1/4}\mathrm{"} \ge 42\mathrm{"}$

From four black prints, cut: 1 square, $3^{1/2}$ " x $3^{1/2}$ " From each (10) black print, cut: 1 strip, $1^{1/4}$ " x 42"



Center Block - Make One

From cream print, cut: 4 strips, $1^{1/4}$ " x $3^{1/2}$ "

From black print, cut 1 square $1^{1/4}$ " x $1^{1/4}$ "

1. Arrange four black $3^{1/2}$ " squares, one black $1^{1/4}$ " square and four cream $1^{1/4}$ " x $3^{1/2}$ " strips in rows. Sew the units in each row together. Join the rows to make a block that measures $7^{1/4}$ " square, including seam allowances.

Strip Piecing


From each black print, cut: 2 strips 1 1/4" x 12" and 2 strips, 1 1/4" x 4"

1. Layout the strips as diagramed and sew together using a accurate 1/4" seam allowance.

2. Finger press as you add each strip. Give your strip set a gentle press to avoid distortion.

Cut indicated number of segments






Bar Block ~ Make Four

From cream print, cut: $8 \, \text{strips} \, 2^{\, 3/4}$ " x $7^{\, 1/4}$ "

1. Layout four center bar units and sew together.

2. Add cream strips to each side of bar unit to create four blocks that measure $7^{1/4}$ " square, including seam allowances.



Double Nine-Patch - Make Four

f r From cream print, cut: 16 squares, $2^{\,3/4}$ " x $2^{\,3/4}$ "

1. Using $1^{1/4}$ " segments from strip piecing, make 20 Nine Patch blocks that measure $2^{5/4}$ " square, including seam allowances.

1. Layout block in three rows. Sew the units in each row together. Join the rows alternating seams at intersections. Block should measure $7^{1/4}$ square, including seam allowances.

Finishing

Use diagram above to layout guilt top in three rows. Sew blocks in each row together. Join the rows alternating seams at intersections. Quilt as desired, I guilted mine back to back with a all over meander, bind and enjoy!
