Tiny Trees

Finished Size $7^{1/2}$ " x $10^{1/2}$ "

Cutting:

From a variety of green prints cut:

 $9 \, \mathrm{triangles} \, \mathrm{using} \, \mathrm{template} \, A.$

From light solid cut:

 $9\,|\,2"\,x\,4^{\,1/4}"\,\text{rectangle}\,|\,\text{cut}\,\text{diagonally}\,\text{once}$

 $18\,|\,1^{1/4}\text{"}\,\mathrm{x}\,1^{1/2}\text{"}\,\mathrm{rectangle}$

From brown print cut:

 $9|1^{1/8}$ " x $1^{1/4}$ " rectangle


From red print cut:


 $1|1^{1/2}$ " x width of fabric strip | binding

Assemble:

- 1. Using 1 green triangle and 2 light triangles, piece tree top by sewing one light triangle along edge of green triangle and pressing open. Repeat on opposite side. Practice with one tree to make sure you get off set correct.
- $2. \ Make trunk section using 1 trunk rectangle and 2 \\ light triangles.$
- 3. Sew trunk section to tree top.
- 4. Piece 3 rows of 3 blocks together using diagram.
- 5. Quilt as desired. I hand guilted mine with different little garland designs for each tree.
- 6. Bind using single thickness binding.
