Finished Quilt 36" x 48" | Finished Blocks 3" + 6"



Fabric Requirements

Large variety of medium and dark scraps 1 yards light print 1/2 yard green print | border 1/2 yard blue print | binding 11/2 yard | backing

Cutting for one block | Cut 168 blocks

From a variety of medium and dark prints, cut:

Print One ~ 2 squares, 2" x 2" | 168 pairs total Print Two - 2 squares, 2" x 2" | 168 pairs total 2 squares, 17/8" $\times 17/8$ " cut diagonally once

You will need a total of 336 pairs of 2" squares

From light print, cut:

9 strips, $3^{7/8}$ " x 42" subcut:

 $84 \, \text{squares}, 3^{7/8} \, \text{x} \, 3^{7/8} \, \text{cut diagonally once}$

From green print, cut:

 $2 \text{ strips}, 3^{1/2}$ " x $36^{1/2}$ "


From blue print, cut: 5 strips, $2^{1/4}$ " x 42"

Making the blocks | Make 168 blocks


1. Using print one and print two - 2" squares, make three half square triangles. Draw a diagonal line on wrong side of print squares. Pair up squares and sew 1/4" on each side of line. Cut on line, press and square each unit to 11/2" square including seam allowances.

2. Layout square and triangle units using diagram. Join units to make a block measuring 31/2" square, including seam allowances.

3. Join four $3^{1/2}$ blocks to make one pinwheel block. Make 42 blocks measuring 6 1/2" square, including seam allowances.









Assembling the quilt

- 1. Lay out quilt top in twelve rows of ten blocks, alternating blocks to nest together seam allowances.
- 2. Join the rows alternating seams at intersections.
- 3. Add top and bottom borders to quilt center.
- 4. Quilt as desired and bind.
